SNGT House Corporation is Considering Options on How to Pay Down the Mortgage

Recent Contributions Have Reduced the Mortgage to Less Than \$2 Million

With the start of the new school year, I thought I would give a short recap of the House Corporation and how it works with the chapter to provide a house for the actives and alumni to enjoy.

The house is owned by the SNGT House Corporation, which is run by a board of chapter alumni who do not receive compensation for services. The House Corporation was responsible for building the house and financing its construction.

The chapter signs a lease every year to live in the house and pays rent to the House Corporation. The rent payments cover interest on the mortgage, property taxes, insurance, and some capital improvements. The chapter is responsible for utilities and regular maintenance of the house. Because the house was new and interest rates have remained low, the House Corporation has not raised the rent for five years until this year when rent went up by 3%. The increased rent is primarily targeted to cover higher costs for capital improvements that are required as the house ages.

Collectively, we have come a long way, but we still need your help to reduce the mortgage to \$1.5 million for the long term strength of the chapter and House Corporation. We have been fortunate to have had a period of low interest rates, which meant more of each dollar contributed has gone to paying down debt instead of paying interest.

Although we call the building the chapter house, it does not qualify for a typical home mortgage with a long term fixed interest rate like a normal house. The house is considered commercial property, and the House Corporation must utilize a commercial bank loan of 3 to 5 years to finance the property. The current mortgage has a term through next June, but the House Corporation is now in the process of working with our bank to refinance the loan while rates are still low. We have numerous options to consider for term and rate. The board of the House Corporation will consider the various options and make a decision soon.

Former Commander Recalls How Sigma Nu Overcame Tough Financial Times

Reading your e-mails about the needs for additional funds brings back wonderful memories of the former house and a similar financial situation we faced. After World War II, the State of Georgia decided to build a new North Expressway that had a centerline that ran through the living room of our Sigma Nu house on 5th Street. Dean Phil Narramore bought and moved six houses affected by the construction.

Sigma Nu, along with Kappa Sigma, TKE, Phi Kappa Sigma and two others, moved into rental houses, which were just north of 3rd Street and fronting the muddy mess that became the expressway.

In 1950, Dean George Griffin swung his weight to piece together three small tracts of

land for us to build on along Fowler St. **Bill Finch**, a Gamma Alpha alum and a leading Atlanta architect, designed a two-story house that would be the most modern on campus. Alumni pledges and funds from the 5th St. house sale would provide the \$88,000 needed for construction. Unfortunately, the Korean War and the recession hit and our costs skyrocketed to over \$150,000 with many of our alumni donors unable to fulfill their pledges.

Due to a lack of funds, our two-story house became a one-story house. **Roger Brown GA #710** was Commander and **Jim Baldwin GA #707** was Lt. Commander in the spring and summer of 1951 while the house was being finished. They had to equip the kitchen and buy beds and furniture. Our drapes came from **Lamar Latimer GA**

#783, who convinced his family to donate them.

When I took over as the first Commander elected in the new house and **Mac Taylor GA #737** was elected as Lt. Commander, Roger handed me the gavel and the financial books with \$3.18 in our bank account. Somehow, we managed but had to operate on a shoe string. It was great fun with a great Band of Brothers.

So pleased to see Sigma Nu still going strong.

JUST FOR FUN

George P. Burdell: An Enduring Student, Legend

Like all tireless legends, the conception of **George P. Burdell** at Georgia Tech remains a mystery. Alum William Edgar "Ed" Smith, BS 30, claimed creation of Burdell in 1927 to the Atlanta Journal-Constitution in 1977.

Smith was filling out his enrollment papers. As a prank, he decided to turn in duplicates under his former principal and Georgia alum George P. Butler. After writing George P., Smith lost nerve and finished the entry with Burdell.

Smith then enrolled Burdell in classes. He even took duplicate tests using Burdell's name, altering the handwriting just enough to ensure

he fooled the professors.

By 1930, George P. Burdell had taken enough tests to "earn" a bachelor's degree from the Institute - later receiving his Master's degree and becoming an official alumnus. At the same time, he has managed to maintain his student status to this day.

During World War II, George P. Burdell served in the armed forces on many fronts, his name appearing around the world. He was listed on the flight crew of a B-17 bomber, flying 12 missions over Europe. However, when a Tech graduate became the new operations officer he immediately recognized the

name and Burdell's flying days were over.

When Georgia Tech computerized its registration in 1969, Burdell signed up for every available course. And despite subsequent fail-safe procedures to prevent it, he did so again in 1975 and 1980.

The spirit of George P. Burdell thrives. He continues to post letters to the editor, baffle salesmen and get paged at football games. But he's displayed a generous nature, with his signature appearing on numerous rebate checks.
