Alumni & Parent Support Helps Chapter Focus on Being Its Best

With 2014 well underway, we are hopeful that this upcoming year will be historical for Gamma Alpha. With a renewed focus on serving the community, scholarship, and campus involvement, Gamma Alpha is making strides to maintain itself as the top fraternity on Georgia Tech's campus. None of this would be possible without the support and assistance of our Alumni Association. Contributions from the Capital Campaign, individual donations, and support of every alumnus are helping to build a better Sigma Nu. Without the support of our alumni, we would not have been able to accomplish as much as we have.

This past Fall, Gamma Alpha continued to be a leader among the fraternities at Georgia Tech by being named the most philanthropic fraternity on campus while maintaining a 3.15 GPA. Our brothers also continue to hold influential positions external to Sigma Nu within organizations on Georgia Tech's campus. Brother **Daniel Furman (TA 2111)** was recently elected to serve a term as the COO of the Georgia Tech Student Foundation and Brother **Eric Keener (TA 2088)** was elected to serve a term as CFO of the Georgia Tech Student Foundation. We are asking for your renewed support this year to raise \$30,000.


It is our goal to have every brother give \$100 a year, every year, at a minimum.

ANONYMOUS CHALLENGE FUND

Two-For-One Match On Your Pledge; \$50,000 Match Expires June 1, 2014


